DID YOU KNOW

From December 17th to 23rd, the monks chant what are known as the "O Antiphons" at Vespers. The origins of this tradition date to as early as the 6th century. Each antiphon highlights one of the 7 Messianic titles: Emmanuel (God with us), Rex (King), Oriens (Eastern Dawn), Clavis David (Key of David), Radix Jesse (Root of Jesse), Adonai (Lord), and Sapientia (Wisdom).

rom the very early days community's ∎ of the foundation in Vina we have been richly blessed with generous people who have volunteered their time and talents in many ways. In recent years the abbot felt it was time to formalize this gift into a structured program in order to make best use of volunteer help and to make it a more enriching experience for those who support us with their service. Especially with shrinking numbers of monks the help of our volunteers is truly appreciated.

My role as Volunteer Program director is to oversee the program, process volunteer applications, to make known volunteer opportunities and match interested persons with specific departments in need of help. The volunteers then work directly under their department head. For instance, we have volunteers helping out

as docents giving tours of the monastery grounds and new church, doing clerical work, landscaping, and cataloging in



our archives office.



Also, unless specified otherwise, for practical purposes we limit our Abbey volunteers to those in our local Chico/Red Bluff area.

While the praying monastic community is at the heart of this endeavor, we cannot do it alone. A LABYRINTH WALK

On September 8, 2019 our Brother William made his solemn profession of lifetime vows as a Cistercian monk of New Clairvaux Abbey. In this article, he shares some of his spiritual preparation for this momentous decision.

n September 8, 2019 our Brother William made his solemn profession of lifetime vows as a Cistercian monk of New Clairvaux Abbey. In this Blog he shares some of his spiritual preparation for this momentous decision:

Before I made my solemn profession, I was on week retreat at the Mercy Sisters' house in Auburn, CA. The beautiful, scenic and quiet environment was most conducive for a silent retreat, true silence that uplift and invades my spirit and soul.



The first scripture passage was from Colossians 1:9 - "We ask God to fill you with the knowledge of His will with all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives." It was much food for thought as a start to a retreat as I meditate on the passage over and over. I was blessed with the opportunity to walk the labyrinth in the garden each evening. The labyrinth illuminates my path and was therapeutic. The path taken in



the labyrinth was similar to the circuitous monastic journey that I have embarked upon. I had time to recall and questions also arise, "Why am I here, am I ready to take my solemn vows in two weeks' time?"

I prayed fervently and asked for the grace to change myself, in Cistercian parlance it is the "conversatio morum" (the conversion of ways). I also had more time to pray and carry others into my prayers for families, friends and sharing in their lives of sufferings, problems and joy.


The final scripture passage was from 2 Peter 1:10 - "Brothers, you have been called and chosen, work all the harder to justify it by good deeds."

That was liberation and joyfulness. I realize that the Spirit of God was leading me and now I am ready to pronounce the profession formula as set in his Rule by our holy father Saint Benedict so many years ago:




"Receive me, O Lord as you have promised that I may live. Do not disappoint me in my hope."


